Q1. Which of the following comes closest to your view regarding artificial intelligence (AI)?

41% Congress should be the driving force behind AI policies and regulations because it represents the public interest, ensuring that regulations cater to social, ethical, and safety concerns, rather than being driven solely by the profit motives of technology companies.
