Q1 I'm going to ask you your opinion about several executives of big tech companies. Here's the first one: do you have a very favorable, somewhat favorable, somewhat unfavorable, or very unfavorable opinion of Meta CEO Mark Zuckerberg?

Q6 Here's some more information about the executives asked about earlier. Critics say Meta and Mark Zuckerberg currently face a 41-state federal lawsuit for helping to fuel a youth mental health crisis and for designing products to manipulate children. Mark Zuckerberg personally rejected proposals to improve the mental health of teen users on his platform. And Meta's Trust and Safety team warned its executives that adults were abusing Facebook and Instagram paid-subscription tools to exploit children and procure child sex abuse material, only for those warnings to be ignored. And Google has committed a number of free speech violations, including blocking Christian organizations from purchasing ads and blocking pro-family websites. And last year Tim Cook and Apple deplatformed The Glenn Beck Program, a conservative podcast.
